

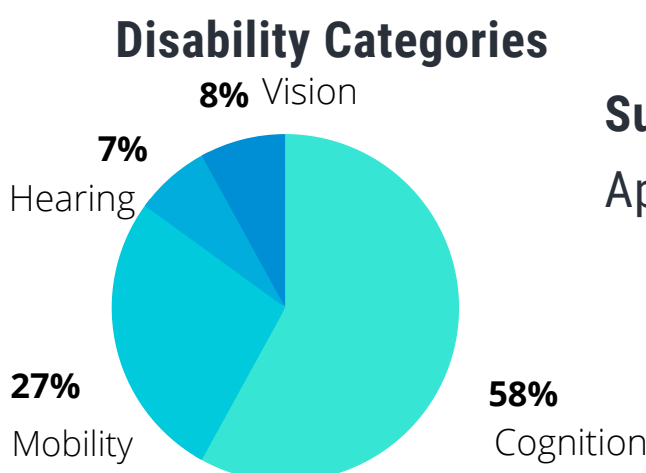


AAHD COVID-19 & DISABILITY SURVEY

KEY FINDINGS - INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES, AUTISM, EPILEPSY, OR BRAIN INJURY

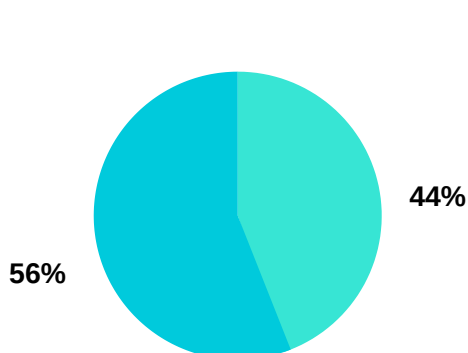
72% Respondents have a DCW



76% Respondents still receive DCW Services

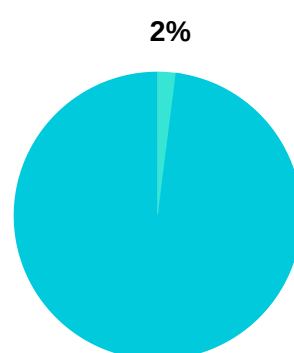


50% Respondents are unable to maintain a safe distance from their DCW

No Disruptions (44%)

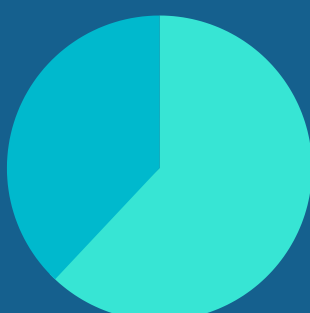


Respondents who Take Medications

NEW CHALLENGES

Respondents who reported facing new challenges to accessing health care 38%



Respondents who reported they were not facing new challenges to accessing health care 62%
