Dear Majority Leader Schumer, Republican Leader McConnell, Speaker Pelosi, Minority Leader McCarthy,

We, the Friends of NQF, request your support for continued investments in critical healthcare quality improvement and measurement initiatives. The Friends of NQF is a multistakeholder coalition of organizations committed to voicing their support for NQF's mission to improve the nation's health through quality measurement and improvement. Specifically, our organizations strongly urge you to authorize \$30 million in Medicare funding to support quality measurement at the National Quality Forum (NQF) for fiscal year 2022 and 2023 each.

Since its inception, NQF has garnered strong bipartisan support for its consensus building leadership. Barring immediate action, precious federal quality funding will be cut to historic lows at a time when the nation is grappling with a global pandemic; the healthcare ecosystem is yearning for meaningful opportunities to reduce burden while improving quality; consumers and purchasers are searching for safe, effective, affordable care; and the country is building critical momentum towards value-based care. Funding NQF is vital to sustaining these efforts.

Founded over twenty years ago as a national response to systemic healthcare quality issues, NQF serves as the trusted forum to drive multiple perspectives into actions that create measurable health improvements. Sharing a common purpose, NQF brings all stakeholders – physicians, nurses, hospitals, patient and caregivers, policy leaders, health plans, employers, and more – together to reach difficult consensus. As part of this mission and with one, non-partisan voice, NQF promotes federal policies supporting the vision that every person experiences high value care and optimal health outcomes.

COVID-19 has brought the strengths and weaknesses of America's healthcare delivery system into sharp focus. Fundamental to addressing these challenges is building a stronger healthcare system - more focused, cohesive, resilient, and responsive. Multistakeholder collaboration is essential to breaking down silos across the health system, addressing healthcare disparities, embracing innovation, and creating patient-driven measures of quality. NQF is the trusted, safe forum for these diverse stakeholders to review important evidence and innovations, debate and disagree, and then build critical

consensus to move the nation forward. These efforts will produce better health outcomes and deliver greater value for the Medicare program, for patients, and for all the people who dedicate their careers and their lives to delivering healthcare in the United States.

Finally, funding NQF's quality work supports critical needs in every community across the county. These efforts include addressing historic rates of opioid and substance use disorder, escalating mental and behavioral health concerns, social determinants of health, as well as challenges unique to rural communities. It also includes advancing technological innovations and new payment models to improve affordability and outcomes, reduce administrative burden, and improve data reliability and flow to achieve real-time insights, even at the bedside. These are just a few of the critical efforts currently underway that, with your support, must continue.

We greatly appreciate the continued bipartisan support of NQF. Congress's reauthorization of NQF's funding at the \$30 million level will sustain the initiatives above and help to assure patients' choice of the highest quality care and support Medicare's continued shift to value-based purchasing. It is imperative that it receive the necessary resources to fulfill its important role in this effort.
