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# **Examples of Disabled Health Disparities**

- Worse oral health
- More likely to smoke
- Less likely to participate in physical activity
- Higher rates of chronic health conditions (e.g., cardiac disease, diabetes, etc.)
- More likely to acquire new health conditions and disabilities
- People with Down syndrome die 20 years earlier

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"Many of the differences in health outcomes between persons with disabilities and those without cannot be explained by the underlying health condition or impairment and are associated with avoidable unjust or unfair factors." (World Health Organization, 2022, p. 15)

"*Disparity* simply indicates a difference between two groups, while the use of *inequity* explicitly characterizes these differences as unjust, avoidable, and unnecessary." (Darby et al., 2022, p. 1394)

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
## **Barriers to Accessing Care**

  hinders health and health care





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

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# Financial Hardship During the Pandemic: Disabled People Difficulty Paying Household Expenses





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# Housing

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- Lack of affordable, accessible housing
- Disabled people more likely to:
  - Be housing insecure
  - Live in poorer quality housing
  - Live in poorer quality neighborhoods
  - Be unhoused
- Factors such as financial insecurity, residential segregation, racism, and ableism both increase disabled people's housing insecurity and negatively impact health

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# Education & Employment

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


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- Unemployment





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# Social and Political Structures

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


- Healthcare policies

# Impact of Increased Pandemic HCBS Payments on Continuity and Security of People with IDD




#### State: Average Increase in HCBS Payment Rates







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# **Impact of Ableism and Racism on Quality of Life of BIPOC with IDD**



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

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# **The Social Determinants of Health Index**

### Factor 1: Choice And Engagement

- People interact with other members of the community
- People participate in the life of the community
- People perform different social roles
- People choose where to work
- People choose where and with whom to live

### **Factor 2: Person-centeredness**

- People exercise rights
- People are treated fairly
- People are respected
- People experience continuity and security

### Factor 3: Health And Safety

- People have the best possible health
- People are safe

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







Asian People (compared to White people)




People who live in ICF (compared to people who live in their own homes)
