Dear Chair Aderholt and Ranking Member DeLauro:

On behalf of the undersigned patient and provider groups, we would like to extend our gratitude for the inclusion of our requested report language regarding the <u>Medicare</u> <u>Prescription Payment Plan</u> (MPPP). We appreciate your continued leadership and support for ensuring that Medicare Part D beneficiaries can take advantage of the program.

Congress enacted the MPPP to provide Medicare Part D beneficiaries the option to pay their prescription drug costs in monthly installments over the course of a plan year. This is particulary impactful for beneficiaries with high cost medication on fixed incomes. Being a new program that a beneficiary must opt into, significant outreach and education efforts, including collaboration with providers and pharmacies, are necessary. The success of MPPP will, in part, be dictated by the ability to reach these individuals and help them understand their new option to enroll and smooth their out-of-pocket payments over the course of the year.

The report language importantly directs the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to report to Congress on uptake of the MPPP, the methods by which CMS is educating beneficiaries about the program, identifying barriers to participation, and outreach efforts with stakeholders such as provider associations and societies, patient and consumer advocacy groups, pharmacy benefit managers, pharmacies, and health insurance providers. CMS is also instructed to continue to explore mechanisms to facilitate point-of-sale enrollment to ensure easy access to the program.

We deeply appreciate the Subcommittee's continued attention to this matter. The information requested of CMS in the Committee report is crucial to ensuring the program is implemented as Congress intended.
